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Subject: History	<p><b><u>Autonomy</u></b> Children are encouraged to explore the past and begin to make sense of the similarities and differences in human experiences across time. They can begin to relate this to their experience of the ever changing world in which they live in.</p> <p><b><u>Mental Health</u></b> Learning about good role models from the past can encourage pupils to view themselves positively when they begin to relate to their work and achievements. History gives regular opportunities for children to contribute and discuss things together and therefore build effective relationships between peers.</p>	<p><b><u>High expectations nurtured</u></b> Good presentation is expected in all subjects and History is no exception. The children are encouraged to have pride in their work and achievements.</p> <p><b><u>Aiming High - Perseverance</u></b> Children are regularly reminded that progress is achieved through repetition and perseverance. Remembering dates and details of historical events can be tricky so regular recaps and quizzes are used by teachers to consolidate learning.</p>	<p><b><u>Respect</u></b> Learning how things change over time and understanding that the life experiences of our parents and grandparents will be different to ours. Through our British Values work we also understand the sacrifices that people had to make for us to live our lives with freedom today.</p> <p><b><u>Independence</u></b> The children are encouraged to think for themselves and respect their own individuality and differences.</p> <p><b><u>Celebrate</u></b> Celebrating each other's talents and respecting each other's feelings during evaluations. We have displays of children's work around school.</p>	<p><b><u>Independence</u></b> In Nursery and Upper Foundation children are free to choose their own resources to support their learning. They enjoy and make sense of the past through hands on learning and role play activities. Exploring new ideas and engaging with them through speaking, listening, watching, thinking and doing. Other year groups work independently to solve the different challenges given whilst exploring their environment.</p> <p><b><u>Inspire</u></b> We inspire children through interesting and relevant activities. 	<p><b><u>Physical Health</u></b> Getting the children outdoors, visiting places steeped in local history enables children to connect with the past and helps them piece together where historical events happened.</p> <p><b><u>Care for self and others</u></b> The children are encouraged to value each other's opinions and points of view during discussions and exploration of artefacts.</p> <p><b><u>Links with community</u></b> History activities for all year groups are shared on Twitter. Exploring a selection of old Victorian toys inspires children to ask questions and to find out more about the era and how children would play.</p> <p><b><u>Relationships</u></b> Problem solving tasks allow the children to talk about their work with their friends and work together. They can sit in non-differentiated groups so they can explore relationships with other children. Teachers can also observe different skills that children may not display in core subjects.</p> <p><b><u>Experiential learning inside and outside</u></b> We continue to develop our history knowledge outside the classroom, for example when we the Year 1 children play with Victorian toys and when Year 2 visit the War Memorial in the town centre on Remembrance Day.</p>	
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
